Leoš Janáček (3 July 1854 - 12 August 1928) was a Czech composer, music theorist, folklorist, publicist, and teacher. He was inspired by Moravian and other Slavic music, including Eastern European folk music, to create an original, modern musical style.



August Nölck (9 January 1862 in Lübeck – 12 December 1928 in Dresden) was a prolific composer, virtuoso cellist, pianist, and music educator of the German School of Romanticism. Nölck is well known for his cello repertoire.



West Side Story (music: Leonard Bernstein, lyrics: Stephen Sondheim) sets the story of Romeo and Julia in the mid-1950s Upper West Side of Manhattan.

The dark theme, sophisticated music, and focus on social problems marked a turning point in musical theatre.

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
